BYE-BYE AND BEST WISHES TO REBEKAH

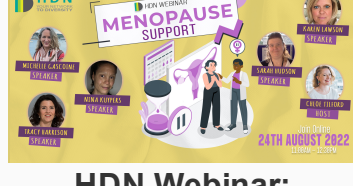


Our research Intern, Rebekah Gregg, has sadly said her goodbyes to us, or 'au revoir' as Moreen would say.
