On the other side of the planet the Women's World Cup kicks off on Thursday and Sarina Wiegman's Lionesses are hoping to repeat their Euro 2022 triumph. But it will be difficult, and this time it's Australia on home soil and, skippered by Chelsea star Sam Kerr, arguably the best player in the women's game the Matildas have a great chance.

Australia open up the tournament with a match against Republic of Ireland on Thursday; the Irish preparations were hampered when their final warm-up game against Colombia was called off after 20 minutes when it became over physical.
