A special Black History Month HDN Webinar held in conjunction with Placeshapers and Communities that Work.

Over the last two years HDN have spoken with boards, executive teams and managers about the Black Lives Matter movement, racism in the UK, and tackling inequality in the housing sector. It goes without saying that these have been a tumultuous two years and this event looks at the progress that's been made, and the pitfalls that organisations have encountered. Most of all we want to ask: do black lives still matter?

Peter Apps, the journalist from Inside Housing who has provided the most comprehensive coverage of the Grenfell Tower tragedy, will discuss how badly the victims- most of whom were from a black and minority ethnic backgroundswere failed both by their landlord and the housing system.

Andrea Barry from the Youth Futures Foundation will reflect on how ethnic disparities are still evident, particularly in the labour market and what organisations can do to tackle these inequalities.

Tracey Gore, Director of Steve Biko Housing Association, one of only two black and racial minority (BRM) housing associations based on Merseyside, will also be joining the panel.

Alozie Ohuonu, Building Safety Manager at Clarion Housing Group, will be Chairing the session.
