HELP US TO TACKLE ISLAMOPHOBIA

November is Islamophobia Awareness Month and, here at HDN, we'll be working with our partners and members as we try to find solutions to at least some of the problems experienced by Muslims in the face of bigotry and racial discrimination.

Nobody should be targeted because of their beliefs, but a total lack of understanding on the part of the prejudiced means that our Muslim population gets more than its fair share of negative attention. Social media is under the microscope again as a Facebook whistleblower currently speaks to our government, explaining how algorithms used by the social media giant are making hate worse. Former employee Frances Haugen has told MPs, at a meeting of the joint committee on the draft Online Safety Bill, that the algorithms help to 'prioritise extreme content.'

And some people don't need much encouragement. Members of a Labour Group in Wakefield have recently received anonymous post which warned of a 'Muslim takeover' and described Islam as 'dangerous'. One of the letters said, 'as a devout Christian, we cannot allow Muslims to take over'.

Get your head around that if you can!

The objectives of the Network are to be agreed by members, but at heart we hope the meetings will help to improve understanding of equality, diversity and inclusion in the sector as well as improving the number of BME leaders and profiling the diverse range of BME leaders currently delivering housing solutions.
