Peter Apps, the journalist from Inside Housing who has provided the most comprehensive coverage of the Grenfell Tower tragedy, will discuss how badly the victims- most of whom were from a black and minority ethnic backgrounds-

were failed both by their landlord and the housing system.

Andrea Barry from the Youth Futures Foundation will reflect on how ethnic disparities are still evident, particularly in the labour market and what organisations can do to tackle these inequalities.
